SPEEDING:

There was no Community Speed Watch for January. This was due to uncertain duties of the Pcso. However this has been resolved and the following dates have been booked;

Hughenden Valley; Morning of 09th March 2012 Widmer End; Morning of 12th March 2012 Naphill; Morning of 13th March 2012 Great Kingshill; Afternoon of 20th March 2012

The locations and times are yet to be established but each ward will have at least 1 SID deployment over the period. We will then be able to inform you of the location and time that is appropriate to your ward.

February Results Naphill; 14 in excess of threshold

Hughenden Valley; 43 in excess of threshold Great Kingshill; 18 in excess of threshold

Widmer End; CANCELLED, due to Police operational matters.

The registered keepers of the vehicles will receive letters under the Community Speed Watch Scheme.

Please bear in mind that persons who receive Speed Watch letters are NOT given the speed that initiated the letter. There is a threshold which is strictly adhered to. When the device is activated the initial speed is the speed recorded by the operators and <u>not</u> the speed as the vehicle passes the device. The speed captured is that of at least 70 metres prior to the device.
