SPEEDING:

Due to a fault with the SID equipment, there will be no allocated Community Speed Watch dates set until further notice.

There is some light at the end of the tunnel; the device repair is to be discussed at the September budget meeting.

CRIME WITHIN THE PARISH;

Criminal Damage to a building in Naphill.

However, there are other reports that come into the Police, these may be related to crimes or recorded due to their nature.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR;

An operation to reduce ASB within the Wycombe Policing area has been running for the last few weeks. The results are proving very successful. Officers are tackling ASB related calls quickly and effectively. Fixed penalties and other means of dealing with the calls are being administered to individuals that are actively causing problems. The operation is set to remain for the foreseeable future with the aim to clamp down on criminal activity and ASB within the Wycombe area.

OTHER MATTERS;

Changes within the Neighbourhood will come into effect from 01st October 2012. This will not change the way in which Policing is delivered to the parish. However I will be moving stations, across to Princes Risborough. I will inform all recipients of my new contact numbers and address in an e-mail, closer to the date. At this time I am unaware of how the Neighbourhood team will be addressed. The old address is that of the three parishes, Hughenden, Hazlemere & Chepping Wycombe Neighbourhood Police Team (HNPT). This is set to change.

Parking:

Parking complaints generate a very high proportion of calls made to the police. To write about the various parking issues that the HNPT encounter would take forever! There is information to be found on a website called Neighbours from Hell, which has a very informative article about a number of parking problems. The Highway Code website also has information about parking. With the school term just about to start, the parking issues at schools are set to come flooding in. Please look at the Highway Code, even if it is to gently remind yourself as to the rules of motoring.

There is an element of safety that should be adhered too, when taking children out of a vehicle and into school etc. Please remove the children from vehicles by using the pavement side of the vehicle and allowing the children to stand on the pavement and not the road.

Have you Signed up to Thames Valley Alerts?

Thames Valley Alerts is the new system for receiving crime and policing updates for your area. The state-of-the-art system allows anyone who signs up to choose what updates they receive and how they would like to receive it. A new option includes receiving information via text and more traditional landline and email messages will still be available. You can also filter the updates you receive by specifying the priority level of the messages you receive.
