Information regarding BT faster Broadband was emailed to all road reps and subsequently distributed to residents in order for them to express an interest in the hi-speed broadband. At present BT have no plans or obligation to upgrade the Naphill exchange ie telephone numbers beginning with '56'. If BT receive enough expressions of interest they will consider implementing an upgrade. (Since the meeting BT has indicated that superfast broadband will be available for most postcodes serviced by the Naphill exchange towards the end of 2014)

15 NEIGHBOURHOOD ACTION GROUP

JP & RH attended the last meeting held on 21st November.

PC Lee Turnham was pleased to report that the Community Speed Watch in the Greater Hughenden Parish is the most active in Bucks with1,300 letters sent out so far this year and 46% of the activity.

Speed Watch sessions in HV & Bryants Bottom were carried out during Nov & some are arranged for December, including at the weekends. Sad to say, that Valley Road has the highest number of speeding motorists than any of the other villages.

There are 9 locations for the VASs

BMW, Series 5 – In the south of England quite a few have been stolen and it is quite a mystery to the police as to how this is being done.

Unsightly graffiti has become a problem in Widmer End. Action is being taken to apprehend the perpetrators.

Rural policing - Farmers are working in collaboration with the Police now. When white vans

come on to farms farmers take down the registration number and phone 101 and the information goes to the data base in Kidlington. They are fitting tracking units in their tractors, they have grapevines in place and ring 101 to pass on information or if they require help. Lee Turnham thought the Country Watch Alert system is working well.

16 **AOB**:

Hughenden Valley residents have now been issued with new recycling bins and the collections have started. It may look like the waste is all tipped into black bins during collection but these are 'maiden' bins and residents are assured that different waste times remain separate.

Joanne Holt suggested a HVRA Facebook page and offered to create a page for the committee to consider. Facebook allows the community to share information and discuss issues as they arise.
