8.a HVRA/VH/HVFC Sports Initiative Committee Updates

The bid for £45k from 'Fields in Trust' (FIT) was not successful, though they will send us information on other sources of funding.

The 'trading company' now exists & makes the project more visible & stable to external bodies.

Affinity, there has been no response with respect to a contribution on drainage.

Sport England – bids have to be in by 11th Jan for next funding round.

HPC have given £5720 as starter fund to cover all preliminary costs – planning, the survey etc. Note of thanks to JI AI

JP volunteered that once the project is under way & funds obtained he is willing to be the project manager. Thanked.

The VH will become a Friend of FIT, who issue a regular news letter. VH (via MS) to circulate.

8.b Cycle path

Gene DaRocha (Naphill) attended the meeting & spoke about working with WDC.

There is no defined timescale.

8.c AfLP HVRA/ HPC Responses to New Scheme

The charity is in place - Hughenden Community Support Trust. JP reported that following objections an appeal hearing by a 1st tier tribunal is to be held, so the HPC has deferred the handover as yet.

8.d Bryants Bottom defibrillator

AB reported that charity Rural Community Defibrillator Group & the British Heart Foundation promote this. The charity is seeking a contribution.

MS suggested that HVRA contact the charity asking for an outline of the processes for funding &

installation, the expected benefits & costs & what the shortfall would be for 3 devices. JI still advocates helping Bryants Bottom first.

10.e Stables in Bryants Bottom

No current issue.

- **10.f Uplands** a planning application is to be made in January, for 55 dwellings (internal of the main building41 plus Terrace housing 11).
- **10.h Trees Rd** the rainwater gulley on Trees Av works, but not that on Trees Rd. As the Road is not adopted, TfB want to meet those responsible for the road. RH to liaise.
- Trees from 2 Wedgewood Drive overhang the public footpath, a resident has raised with HPC. RH will pass to NAG (NB Owner ill.)
- **10.j** Conifers overhanging Valley Road from a property on South Maundin. No action by HVRA. If the trees have not been cut back TfB will send out another letter.

AI had received a query about salt funded by the RA, it can be used on roads as well as

private drives.

12.e Neighbourhood Watch/Action Group

RH reviewed their minutes & reported:

- there is a proposal for a national litter blitz in March 2016 to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday, & a suggestion to repeat it.
- there is 1 ASBO active in HV.
- Great Kinghill is looking into providing cinema-type facilities for showing films to a wide range of ages. Setting this up could cost in the region of £8,000. Hopefully this would be a pilot scheme for other village halls in the parish.

Following JM's concern over targetting of vulnerable residents, the NAG suggested that each of the 4 wards in HV parish nominate a resident to whom worried others approach for advice. JM & others felt that contacting the police directly was preferred. One problem is the difficulty to communicate the identities of vulnerable people. In the meantime, it was agreed that the village magazines be asked to place some information from the last WDNHWA (Wycombe District Neighbourhood Watch Association) Newsletter which had been given at the meeting in their newsletters

12.f **Speed watch**

Wednesday 14/10/15

- 0730-0830 hours, Bryants Bottom Road, 30 drivers exceeded the speed limit
- 0930-1030 hours, Boss Lane, 36 drivers exceeded the speed limit
- 1100-1200 hours, Orchard Close, 40 drivers exceeded the speed limit

RH reported that in Thames Valley area, 75% of speed watch reports are in Bucks & 75% are in our parish, i.e. 57% of all activity.

13 A.O.B

JD enquired about the price of a speed camera, JP replied that it's of the order of £10k.

AI has received communication from The Chiltern Society outlining the requirement to record all Rights of Way by 2026. See Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 Section 53.

AB following a review of our insurance policy with AC, reported that the policy, with respect to serving food, covers us for cold buffet type of meals. Serving hot food is not covered but we generally use outside caterers in that case.

RH asked about the HPC meeting & plans for a bench on Cryers Hill. JP observed that the idea had been around for some years. Bucks CC would approve it subject to it being accepted by local residents. As reported at the last meeting this has not been accepted.

JI reported a notice in the Naphill Gazette with regard to security at local RAF bases, which sought to reassure locals that there is no apparent increase in local threat. As ever, any untoward activity should be reported to the Group Captain, the RAF police or the civil police.
